Adult assembly is required.


Requires three, **alkaline** button cell batteries (LR44 or equivalent) for operation (included).

Tool required for battery replacement: Phillips screwdriver (not included).



# **Getting Ready for Rescue**

**IMPORTANT!** Attachment of the connector to the figure is a permanent assembly.




- Position the backpack and the figure upright.
- Slide the backpack connector into the grooves on the back of the figure until you hear a "click".
- Slide the backpack up to remove it from the figure. The connector should remain attached to the figure.


## On a Mission


- Fit the backpack onto the connector on the figure's back.
- Press the video screen button to see moving video on the backpack along with sound effects.
- Press the audio button to hear your figure talk. Press again to hear more phrases.

**Hint:** The sound effects and phrases will not play at the same time.



## **Battery Replacement**





- Remove the backpack from the figure.
- Loosen the screw in the battery compartment door with a Phillips screwdriver. Remove the battery compartment door.
- Insert three, new alkaline button cell batteries (LR44 or equivalent), as indicated inside
  the battery compartment. Make sure the flat
  side of each battery (printed with the battery
  designation) faces the spring.

**Hint:** We recommend using **alkaline** batteries for longer life.

- Replace the battery compartment door and tighten the screw with a Phillips screwdriver.
   Do not over-tighten.
- When sounds from this toy become faint or stop, it's time for an adult to change the batteries!

#### **Battery Tips**

- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix different types of batteries: alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium).
- Remove the batteries during long periods of non-use. Always remove exhausted batteries from the toy. Battery leakage and corrosion can damage this toy. Dispose of batteries safely.
- Do not dispose of batteries in a fire. The batteries may explode or leak.
- Never short circuit the battery terminals.
- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended in the Battery Replacement Instructions are to be used.
- If removable rechargeable batteries are used, they are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the toy before they are charged.
- If you use a battery charger, it should be examined regularly for damage to the cord, plug, enclosure and other parts. Do not use a damaged battery charger until it has been properly repaired.

### Care

- Wipe this toy with a clean cloth dampened with a mild soap and water solution. Do not immerse this tov.
- This toy has no consumer serviceable parts. Please do not take this toy apart.


