





2 SET UP

A. Flip switch to I (ON).


1: ON O: OFF

Δ: TRY ME






B. Load darts into barrel and storage.






A. Pull handle back to charge blaster.




C. Push handle back up.




4 RAPID-FIRE

Pull and hold trigger, crank handle up and down for rapid-fire!







D. Pull handle back to charge blaster again.



5 PERFORMANCE TIPS

To reset the number of lit-up lights, press trigger when blaster is uncharged.








- Batteries included are for demonstration purposes only.
- Replace the batteries if lights dim.
- Unscrew the hattery cover with a Phillips head screwdriver (not included)
- Install 2 new AA (LR6) alkaline batteries In the orientation (+/-) shown.
- Replace battery cover and tighten screw.
- For best performance, use alkaline batteries.
- When exposed to an electrostatic source, the blaster may malfunction.

 To resume normal operation, flip the power switch to OFF and ON again.

NOTE: This blaster is equipped with an automatic shut-off feature to help preserve battery life.



1 ATTACHING TARGETS



Peel backing off target before sticking it to surface




Do not stick target to walls or furniture as it may cause damage to the surface.






8 REMOVING DARTS

Keep one hand pressed on target, hold dart by the tip and gently peel dart off.





Dust, dirt, and other debris can cause darts to lose their adhesiveness.

To clean darts, rinse darts' tips with tap water or use tape to remove excess debris.

NOTE: Dry darts before using again.

BATTERY SAFFTY INFORMATION
