🔆 If your vehicle doesn't move when you use the transmitter there's a good chance your vehicle's battery is ready for a recharge.























III. ANTENNA ASSEMBLY

Your antenna comes in two pieces – the base unit and the metal scoping antenna. Remove the antenna from the top of the transmitter and screw it into the cylindrical base in a counter clockwise motion until it is firmly in place. Now pull up on the antenna until it is fully extended. You can remove the antenna for storage and place it back into the canal on top of the transmitter once you're done racing your vehicle.




IV. INSTALLING THE VEHICLES REAR WING

Your vehicle comes with an unnattached rear wing. To install the wing onto the vehicle take the wing in hand and insert its protruding dowels through the slots found on the wing mount at the rear of the vehicle. Once the wing is securely in place slide the supplied clips into the holes.



V. REMOVING THE CHASSIS COVER

In order to insert the Tyco® Pro Flexpak® battery into the vehicle and set your desired racing channel you will need to take off the chassis cover. To do this you will need to remove two small black clips from the vehicle's front and rear dowels. Once you've removed the clips simply pull off the chassis cover.



Make sure to place the clips in a safe spot for easy retrieval. They 're pretty small and could easily get lost. When you're ready to put the cover back on the vehicle make sure to first put the antenna through the right-hand side chassis window (passenger seat side) and place the FRONT end of the chassis cover on the front dowel first and then push down on the back dowel. Re-insert the clips.

VI. MULTI-CHANNEL FEATURE

- Your vehicle features the advanced Hot Wheels® R/C Multi channel system. This system lets you race your vehicle head-to-head – against your friends (up to 8 drivers total) – without any radio interference from your friends' transmitters or vehicles. You must be racing against another Hot Wheels® R/C Multichannel-equipped vehicle for this feature to work.
- There's one Multichannel selector switch on your vehicle, and another one on your transmitter. The vehicle switch has 3 positions: one for each Multichannel settingwhich will allow for a total of 8 possible combinations.



The transmitter switch has 3 positions: one for each Multichannel setting which will allow for a total of 8 possible combinations.




- For successful operation, the vehicle switch and the transmitter switch must be set to the same Multichannel setting. When you're driving by yourself, you can set the switches to any of the 3 Multichannel settings (as long as they match).
- When you want to race head-to-head, just make sure that each driver (up to 8 drivers total) has a vehicle and transmitter set to a different Multi channel setting.
- You must be racing against another Hot Wheels® R/C Multichannel-equipped vehicle for this feature to work. A non-Multichannel vehicle, running on the same frequency as your vehicle, may interfere with operation of your vehicle. If you are racing against a non-Multichannel vehicle, make sure that vehicle operates on a frequency different from yours.
- If you need to change the Multichannel setting, first make sure that your vehicle is turned OFF. Change the switch position as desired, making sure to change both the transmitter AND the vehicle switches. Then turn your vehicle back ON for more racing action. NOTE: Make certain you're not pressing a transmitter control while changing selector switch position.


VII. BATTERY INSTALLATION


Requires a Tyco® 7.2V Pro FlexPak $^{(\!\!\!R)}$ (NiCd) battery pack for vehicle and 4 AA alkaline batteries for transmitter

Vehicle

- 1. Rotate the battery latch to the open position. Open the battery
- door. 2.Insert the battery pack into the battery compartment as shown.
- Ke careful not to place your fingers into the open hole at the bottom of the chassis when inserting the battery.
- 3. Close the battery door. Rotate the battery latch to the locked position.
- 4.To remove the battery pack: first turn the vehicle off, turn the latch on the battery compartment, open the battery door and lift out the battery pack.









Transmitter

- 1. Open the battery door as shown.
- 2. Install 4 "AA" batteries inside the battery compartment as shown.
- 3. Close the battery door.




VIII. RIM AND TIRE REMOVAL

You can replace your tires, rims or both. To replace the rims use the supplied lug wrench embedded in your transmitter to remove the bolts then simply swap out the tires and re-attach the bolts. To remove the tires just peel back and pull off the rubber treads and replace them with a new set.




IX. ADJUSTING THE SUSPENSION

Your vehicle is equipped with adjustable 4-wheel independent suspension. You'll want to raise or lower the chassis depending on different track terrains. To raise or lower the suspension place your thumb and forefinger on the grooved ring found at the top of each coil spring attached to all four wheels. To lower the suspension turn the disc clockwise. To raise the suspension turn the disc counterclockwise.



X. QUICK TIPS

- The best jumps are the ones where the rear wheels hit the ground first. It's important to give your FlashFire™ vehicle just enough power as it leaves the ramp. Too much power and your front end will rise abruptly, too little and you'll land on the front wheels. When you do land, make sure all four wheels are on the ground before you accelerate. If you don't you may cause a wheelie, which may look really cool, but you'll lose time.
- The FlashFire™ was meant to fly high and land soft but just because you can doesn't mean you should – especially if you're in a race. Remember, the more time your FlashFire™ spends in the air, the less time you'll have to accelerate. So stay low to win big!
- It's best to steer clear of potentially damaging terrains like dry river beds where large rocks are often found, water and ponds that can destroy inner circuitry, tall grasslands where reeds can entangle your vehicle and gravel and sand that can put a lot of stress on a motor (think spinning tires with zero movement).
- 4. Build a cross-country racetrack using natural ditches and moderately rocky terrain. Add your own obstacles, like logs, rocks and barrier flags! Winners are usually determined by a who finishes first system or a points/ penalty system. Examples of penalties may be leaving the track or forcing someone else off it. Other examples would be having to unflip your flipped-over car. You could give away points for perfect landings or tough terrain negotiation without bumping into a single obstacle. The bottom line is, you can make up your own rules and have a blast doing it!
- When your vehicle starts to lose power, it may lose functions or performance. It's time for a recharge. For best stunt performance, always start with a fully-charged battery.
- Your vehicle's running time may change depending on your driving style.
- Radio intérference can effect your vehicle's performance. Interference can be caused by other R/C vehicles running on frequency, electrical wires, large buildings, CB radios or other wireless gear. Try to stay away from these!
- Point your transmitter antenna up not down toward your vehicle. If your vehicle gets too far away, it won't work properly.
- Don't drive your vehicle in sand or through water or snow. If your vehicle does get wet, wipe it with a towel and allow it to dry completely.
- Don't store your vehicle near heat or in direct sunlight. Always turn switches OFF and remove all batteries for storage.
- Should you lose either your lug wrench or wheel nut they can be easily replaced with a 0.28"(7mm) socket wrench or 0.28"(7mm) nut.

Safety Tips

Yes, the vehicle rips on the road but no, you should NEVER, EVER drive it on the street!

DO NOT pick up the vehicle while in motion. Take your fingers off the transmitter trigger and then pick it up.

Keep fingers, hair and loose clothing away from the tires while the vehicle is switched ON.

Adult supervision is recommended when this vehicle is being used.

To avoid accidental or unwanted operation, remove all the batteries when not in use. Always turn the vehicle OFF before removing the batteries.

BATTERY SAFETY INFORMATION

In exceptional circumstances batteries may leak fluids that can cause a chemical burn injury or ruin your product. To avoid battery leakage:

- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the product before being charged (if designed to be removable).
- Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision (if designed to be removable).
- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
