## Battery Safety Information

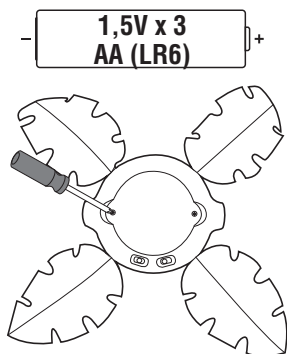

## Battery Installation

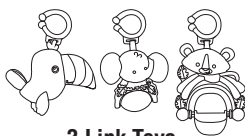


- Locate the battery compartment door on the hub.
- Loosen the screws in the battery compartment door with a Phillips screwdriver and remove the door.
- Insert three AA (LR6) **alkaline** batteries.
- Replace the battery compartment door and tighten the screws. Do not over-tighten.
- If this toy begins to operate erratically, you may need to reset the electronics. Slide the power/volume switch off and back on.
- When sounds or lights become faint or stop, it's time for an adult to change the batteries.

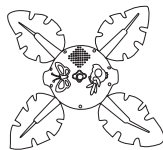

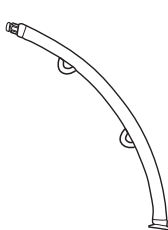

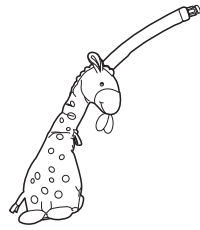

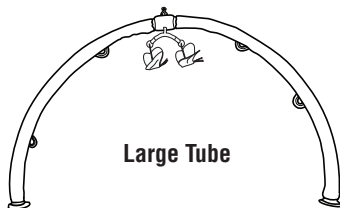

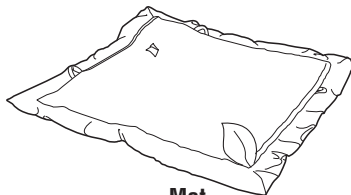
Small Tube



Giraffe Tube

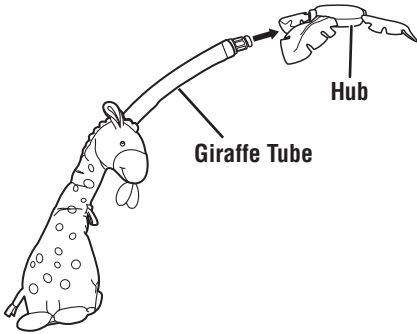


Large Tube



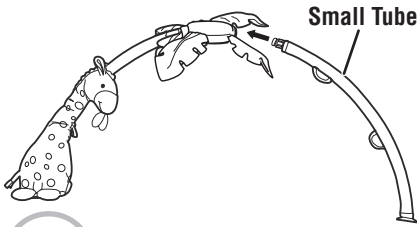

# Assembly



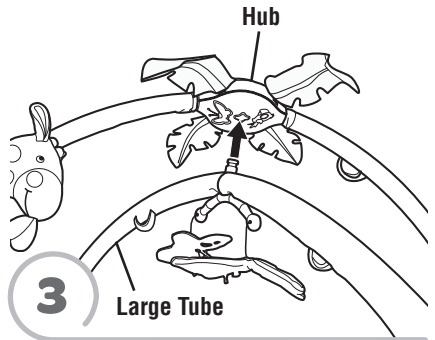

- “Snap” the giraffe tube into the hub.



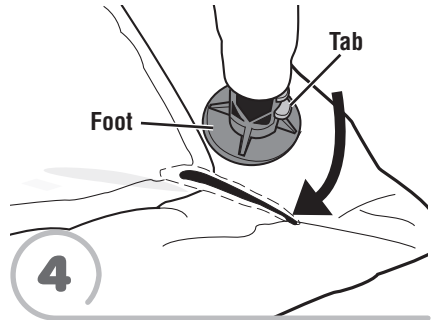

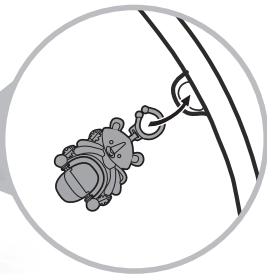
- “Snap” the large tube into the hub.

- Make sure the mat is fitted below the tab on each tube.

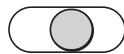


## WARNING

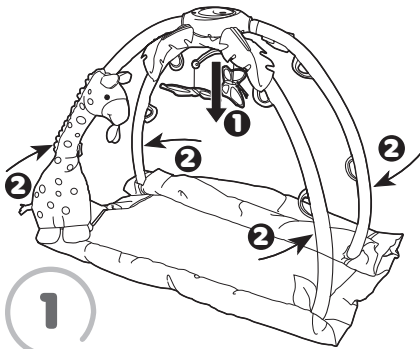
Power/Volume Switch



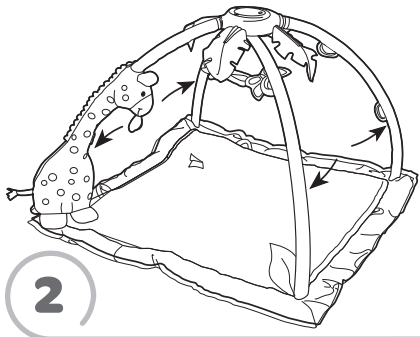
Mode Select Switch

- Hang the link toys from loops or links around the gym.
- Wrap the monkey tail around a loop on the gym.
- Slide the power/volume switch on the hub to ON with low volume (🔊), ON with high volume (🔊), or OFF (🔇).
- Slide the mode select switch on the hub to:
  - 🎵 for music, lights and nature sounds.
  - 🌳 for nature sounds and lights.
  - 👶 for baby-activated music. Lights and music respond to baby's movement.

# Storage and Care



- Pull the butterfly arch down ① and then push the tubes together ②.



- To set up again, pull the tubes apart.

## Mat

- Remove the tubes and activity toys from the mat.
- Machine wash cold on the gentle cycle. Do not use bleach. Tumble dry on low heat.

## Tubes and Activity Toys

- Wipe with a clean cloth dampened with a mild soap and water solution. Do not immerse.
