Tool required for battery replacement: Phillips screwdriver (not included).



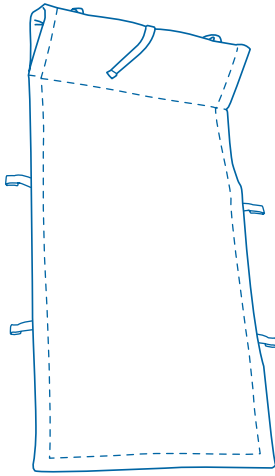

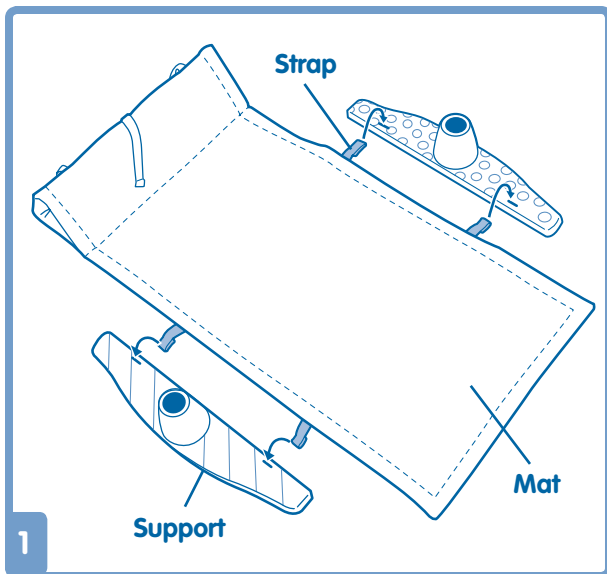
Mat

- Remove the support, tube and activity toys from the mat.
- Machine wash the mat inside a pillow case in cold water on the gentle cycle. Do not use bleach. Line dry the mat.

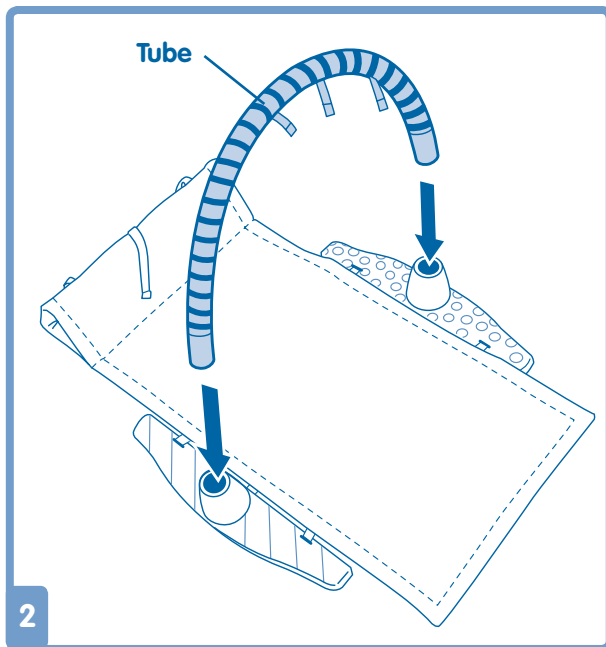
Tube, Supports and Activity Toys

- Wipe with a clean cloth dampened with a mild soap and water solution. Do not immerse.

Assembly



- Fit both straps on each side of the mat down through the slots in the supports. Make sure the tab on the end of the strap forms a "T" under the support.
- Pull up on the mat to be sure it is secured to the supports.



- While bending the tube slightly, into the openings in the supports, as shown.

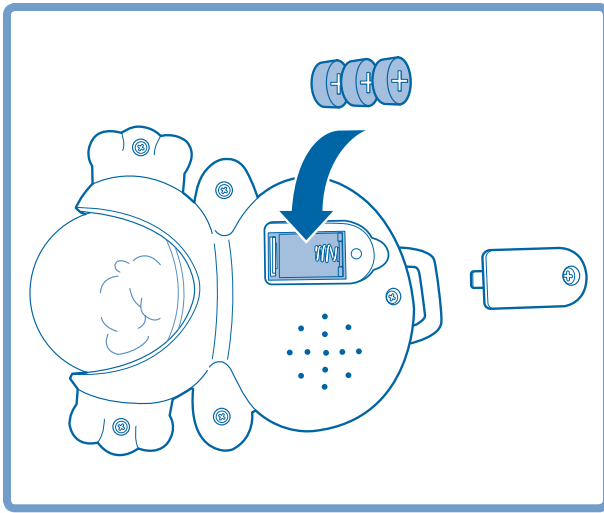

Battery Replacement



- Locate the battery compartment on the back of the penguin.
 - Loosen the screw in the battery compartment door with a Phillips screwdriver. Remove the battery compartment door.
 - Insert three, new button cell (LR44) **alkaline** batteries.
- Hint:** We recommend using **alkaline** batteries for longer battery life.
- Replace the battery compartment door and tighten the screw.
 - When sounds become faint or stop, it's time for an adult to change the batteries!



- Protect the environment by not disposing of this product with household waste (2002/96/EC). Check your local authority for recycling advice and facilities.

Battery Safety Information



In exceptional circumstances, batteries may leak fluids that can cause a chemical burn injury or ruin your toy. To avoid battery leakage:

- Do not mix old and new batteries or batteries of different types: alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium).
- Insert batteries as indicated inside the battery compartment.
- Remove batteries during long periods of non-use. Always remove exhausted batteries from the toy. Dispose of batteries safely. Do not dispose of the product in a fire. The batteries inside may explode or leak.
- Never short-circuit the battery terminals.
- Use only batteries of the same or equivalent type, as recommended.
- Do not charge non-rechargeable batteries.
- Remove rechargeable batteries from the toy before charging.
- If removable, rechargeable batteries are used, they are only to be charged under adult supervision.
