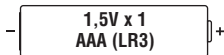
Battery Replacement

Use an **alkaline** battery for longer life.



- Loosen the screws in the battery compartment door with a Phillips screwdriver and remove the door.
- Remove the exhausted battery and dispose properly.
- Insert one, new AAA (LR03) **alkaline** battery.
- Replace the battery compartment door and tighten the screws. Do not over-tighten.
- If this toy begins to operate erratically, you may need to reset the electronics. Remove the battery and reinstall it.
- When sounds or the display become faint or stop, it's time for an adult to change the battery.

Battery Safety Information



In exceptional circumstances, batteries may leak fluids that can cause a chemical burn injury or ruin your product. To avoid battery leakage:

- Do not mix old and new batteries or batteries of different types: alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium).
- Insert batteries as indicated inside the battery compartment.

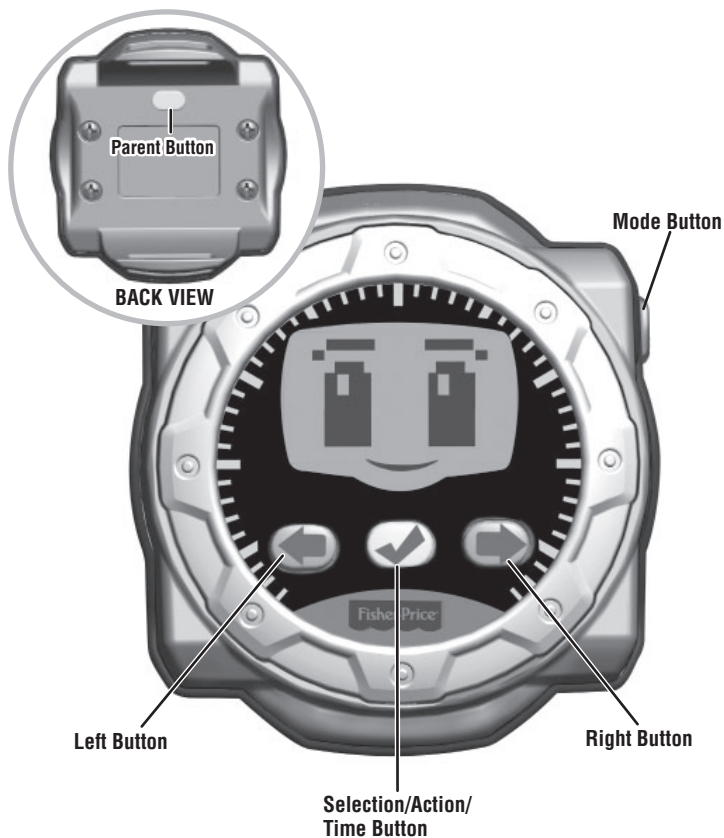

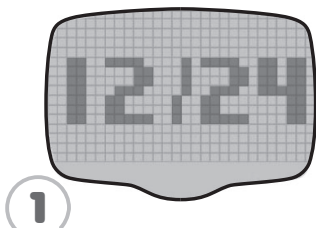

Features



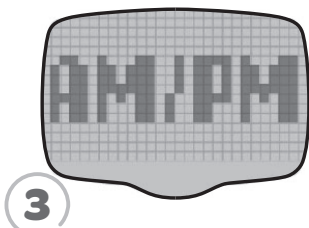
- Before first-time use, you will need to remove this toy from “try-me” mode. Press the parent mode button on the back of the watch to turn off “try-me” mode.

Setup



Set 12-hour or 24-hour clock

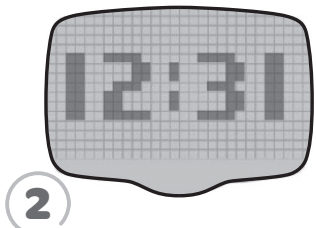
- Press the parent button on the back of the watch.
- Press the ✓ button to change the clock format. Press the ◀ or ▶ button to choose **12-hour** or **24-hour** format.
- Press the ✓ button to save your selection.



Set AM or PM

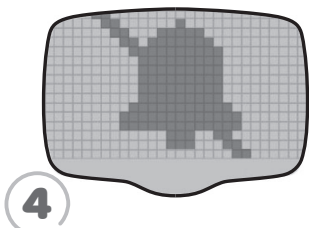
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to choose **AM** or **PM**. Press the ✓ button to save your selection.

***Hint:** You can only change the AM or PM setting when the clock is set to 12-hour format.*



Set Time

- Press the ◀ or ▶ buttons to change the hour. Press the ✓ button to save your selection.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to change the minutes. Press the ✓ button to save your selection.

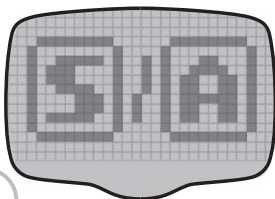


Set Hourly Chime

***Hint:** Hourly chime will only occur between 8 am and 8 pm.*

- Press the parent button twice. Then press the ✓ button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ buttons to scroll through chime sounds or choose no sound.
- Press the ✓ button to save your selection.

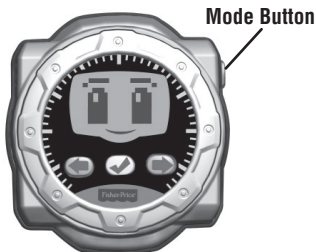
Setup



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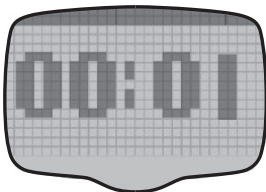
- You can change how the watch tells time - **Simple** (e.g., it's eight fifteen) or **Advanced** (e.g., it's quarter after eight).
- Press the parent button three times and then press the ✓ button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to choose **S** - Simple or **A** - Advanced.
- Press the ✓ button to save your selection.

Choose a Mode



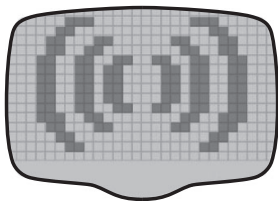
- Press the mode button on the side of the watch to scroll through options: **Clock**, **Stopwatch**, **Race the Clock Game** or **Numbers Pop Game**.

Stopwatch



- Press the ✓ button.
- When you are ready, press the ✓ button again to start the stopwatch.
- To stop or pause the stopwatch, press the ✓ button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to reset the stopwatch.

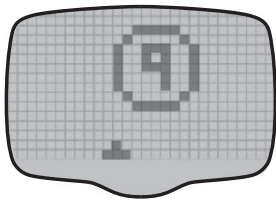
Timer



- Press the ✓ button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to pick a time. Press the ✓ button to save your selection.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to pick a sound. Press the ✓ button to save your selection.
- Press the any button to stop the timer sound.

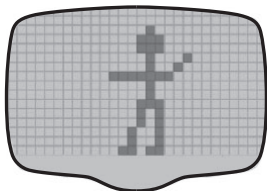
Hint: Once the timer is set, it cannot be shut off until the time that was chosen is complete. If you'd like to change modes while the timer is on, simply press the mode button.

Numbers Pop Game



- Press the ✓ button to start the game.
- Listen for the number in the bubbles you need to pop.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to move the launcher.
- Press the ✓ button to pop the bubbles.
- Pop as many bubbles with the correct number before time runs out!
- Press the ✓ button to start the next round.

Race the Clock Game



- Press the ✓ button to start the game.
- Listen to the challenge and complete your task before time runs out!
- Press the ✓ button to start the next round.
