

## Tuff Stuff® Tape R

IMPORTANT! The play ◆ and record • buttons into the cassette compartment.



MICROPHONE WITH VOICE BUTTON

Press the voice button when recording or to amplify your voice through the speaker. Speak into the microphone to record.

- 2 SPEAKER
- 3 VOICE CHANGE SWITCH
  Slide to select five different warping effects.
- VOLUME DIAL
   Select a comfortable listening level by rotating the volume dial.
- 5 STOP/EJECT

At any time, press the stop/eject button to stop the tape. Press the stop/eject button again to open the cassette door.

6 FAST FORWARD


Press the fast forward button to advance the tape rapidly.

7 REWIND

Press the rewind **b** button to rewind the tape rapidly.

Insert a cassette tape to record, listen or sing-along.

Plug an AC adapter (not included) into the power jack. Before using an AC adapter, be sure your child understands the handling and care of an electrical product (see "AC adapter" instructions).

**12** MICROPHONE STORAGE

Fit the microphone on the back of this toy for easy storage.

(B) HEADPHONE JACK

Plug headphones (not included) into the headphone jack for private listening.

**1** BATTERY COMPARTMENT

Located on the back of this toy. Requires four "C" (LR14) **alkaline** batteries.




Please keep small parts such as plastic tabs out of children's reach. Throw the plastic tab away.

**Note:** A plastic tab was attached to the toy for in-store demonstration purposes. Locate the plastic tab on the back of the toy. Pull and remove the plastic tab. Throw the plastic tab away.

## **Battery Replacement**

For best performance, we recommend replacing the batteries that came with this toy with four, new alkaline "C" (LR14) batteries.





- Loosen the screws in the battery compartment door with a Phillips screwdriver.
- Lift and remove the battery compartment door.
- Insert four "C" (LR14) **alkaline** batteries, as indicated inside the battery compartment.

**Hint:** We recommend the use of **alkaline** batteries for longer battery life.

Replace the battery compartment door and tighten the screws with a Phillips screwdriver. Do not over-tighten.

## **Battery Information**

- · Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not mix different types of batteries: alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium).
- Remove the batteries during long periods of non-use. Always remove exhausted batteries from the product. Battery leakage and corrosion can damage the product. Dispose of batteries safely.
- Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.
   The batteries may explode or leak.
- · Never short circuit the battery terminals.
- Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended in the "Battery Installation" instructions are to be used.
- If removable rechargeable batteries are used, they are only to be charged under adult supervision.
- Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the product before they are charged.
- If you use a battery charger, it should be examined regularly for damage to the cord, plug, enclosure and other parts. Do not use a damaged battery charger until it has been properly repaired.

## **AC Adapter (Not Included)**

Your Fisher-Price® Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder may be used with an AC adapter (not included). If you will be using this product with an AC adapter, make sure it has an output rating of 6 volts DC (Direct Current), 200mA (milli-Amps) minimum. Output lead must have a 5 mm O.D., 2 mm or slightly larger I.D. coaxial plug. Use only an AC adapter approved by a testing agency such as Underwriters Laboratories. Do not use an extension cord with the AC adapter. Polarity of the AC adapter must match Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder power jack center terminal, which is positive. Please refer to the symbol  $\bigcirc$ — $\bigcirc$  on the back of the Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder.


**IMPORTANT!** An AC adapter (not included) is not a toy. Disconnect the AC adapter (if used) from the tape recorder before cleaning.

# Headphones (Not Included)

Your Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder is equipped with a headphone jack for private listening. Be sure your stereo headphones are equipped with a 3.5mm pin.

**Hint:** The speaker does not project sound when a headphone pin is inserted into the headphone jack.

## **Cassette Tape Tips**




- If tape in the cassette loosens (or appears to be unraveling), firmly wind it before inserting it into Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder.
- All cassette tapes include tabs which prevent them from being accidentally erased. To prevent Side 1 from being erased, hold the cassette with the tape opening facing away from you (Side 1 will be printed on top). Break off the tab on the right (see illustration). To prevent Side 2 from being erased, break off the tab on the left.

## **Inserting a Cassette Tape**

We recommend using only 60 minute cassette tapes (C-60) for recording or playing, 30 minutes each side. Cassette tapes longer than 60 minutes are made with thinner material, which reduces performance quality and tangles more easily.

Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder will operate properly with most commercially available pre-recorded and blank cassette tapes. We DO NOT recommend recording on Hi Bias Chromium Dioxide (CrO2) cassette tapes.



- Press the stop/eject button to open the cassette door.
- Insert a cassette tape into the cassette door slots, with the tape opening upward and the desired listening side facing outward.
- Press the cassette door closed. If the cassette door does not close easily, make sure the cassette tape has been inserted properly.

**Hint:** To play or record at the beginning of a cassette tape, rewind it completely.

## **Wacky Voice Warping**

Use this feature in Broadcast, Sing-Along and Record modes.

Slide the voice change switch to any of five positions:



#### Regular

Hear your own voice with no effects.



#### Monster

You can sound like a super, scary monster.



#### Robot

You won't believe how "high-tech" you sound!



#### Chipmunk

Warp your voice to a funny, high pitch. You'll sound like a silly space creature.



#### Alien

### **Broadcast**

Hint: It is not necessary to insert a cassette tape to broadcast.

- Slide the voice change switch to any of five wacky, warped settings.
- Press and hold the voice button while speaking or singing into the microphone.
- Adjust the volume dial to the desired listening level.

## Sing-Along

**IMPORTANT!** The play <sup>♠</sup> button will not operate unless a cassette tape is inserted into the cassette compartment.

- Insert a cassette tape into the Tuff Stuff™ Tape Recorder.
- Slide the voice change switch to any of five wacky, warped positions.
- Press the play ♥ button.
- Press and hold the voice button while speaking or singing on the microphone.
- Adjust the volume dial to the desired listening level.
- Press any of the top buttons to stop the tape.

#### Listen

**IMPORTANT!** The play ◆ button will not operate unless a cassette tape is inserted into the cassette compartment.

- Insert a cassette tape into Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder.
- Adjust the volume dial to the desired listening level.
- Press any of the top buttons to stop the tape.

Hint: Insert your own stereo headphone's pin into the headphone jack for private listening.

#### Record

**IMPORTANT!** The record button will not operate when a pre-recorded cassette tape is inserted into the cassette compartment. Be sure to use a blank cassette tape.

- Insert a blank cassette tape into Tuff Stuff® Tape Recorder.
- Slide the voice change switch to any of the five wacky, warped positions.
- Press the record button to record sounds or your voice.

#### Hints:

- For best results, place the microphone close to the sound source.
- Turn the volume dial down when recording to avoid feedback or interference.
- Hold the microphone and press the voice button when recording.
- Press any of the top buttons to stop the tape.

**IMPORTANT!** We DO NOT recommend recording on CrO2 (Hi Bias Chromium Dioxide) cassette tapes.

#### Maintenance

To maintain performance, we recommend cleaning the magnetic head each time the batteries are changed. To clean the magnetic head, purchase a "cleaning cassette tape". Insert a "cleaning cassette tape" (not included) as you would a regular cassette tape. Press the play ◀) button all the way down and the "cleaning cassette tape" will play through its cycle.
