GET CRICKET*

Crickets are readily available at your local pet store. Bug Racer works best with small to medium crickets, around 1/2-3/4 in (1.27-1.9 cm) in size.

*Cricket not included.

CRICKET FOOD


Crickets eat fruits and vegetables, such as apples and potatoes, which also serve as sources of water. Chop food into small pieces before serving. Do not add water. Cricket food not included.



FEEDING YOUR CRICKET

Push button to open the lid of the habitat.







PUT CRICKET INTO HABITAT

Place the habitat and 1-5 crickets (not included) in a plastic bin with sides about 10 in (25.4 cm) high (not included).



Squeeze the sides to open the collection device. Guide the cricket into a corner with the collection device. Once the cricket is inside, tilt the device up and carefully close.






Insert the collection device into the habitat and release the cricket. Remove habitat from bin and observe your cricket through the magnifying window.











Push the back end of the habitat down to lock in place.

After driving, remember to return the cricket to the habitat area. To do so, open

the door to the control room and allow the cricket to move into the habitat. Close the door.



CLEAN YOUR HABITAT



Open up the vehicle wings. Grab the small handle on top of the habitat. Lift up and pull outward to separate it from the vehicle.



If the cricket is in the control room, move it to the habitat (see previous Helpful Hint). Open the collection device. Gently tilt the habitat to move the cricket into the collection device. Carefully close and then remove the collection device from the habitat.



Release the cricket inside a tall plastic bin (not included). This will be the holding area while the habitat gets cleaned. Use the collection device to move all crickets to the holding area.



Push button to open the lid. Throw out any leftover food and waste. Use warm water only to clean the inside of the habitat. Drain and dry the habitat thoroughly. Close the lid.



Use the collection device to move the crickets one by one from the holding area back into the habitat.



HELPFUL HINT Crickets are sensitive to light. Do not place them in direct sunlight. When you are not observing them, keep vehicle



KEEP THESE INSTRUCTIONS FOR FUTURE REFERENCE AS THEY CONTAIN IMPORTANT INFORMATION. Requires 4 AA alkaline batteries, not included. Dispose of batteries safely.



MORE HELPFUL HINTS

* Don't hold or poke at cricket in habitat.

*Crickets are active at night and can be noisy. * Remove collection device before opening habitat. Move them into another room if they keep you up.

VEHICLE QUICK START

- 1. INSERT BATTERIES AND PLACE HABITAT WITH CRICKET INSIDE OF THE VEHICLE
- TURN POWER ON 3. PRESS BUG BUTTON FOR EACH MODE:
 - CRICKET IN CHARGE
 - DRAG RACING
 - AUTODRIVE
 - LIGHT SHOW

BURYS TO PLAY!

Insert the batteries, and make sure at least one cricket is in the control room of the habitat. Switch the power ON. Select the

mode by pressing the bug button.

- 1) CRICKET IN CHARGE Mode To activate a mode, just
- (3) AUTODRIVE Mode
- (4) LIGHT SHOW Mode

(2) DRAG RACING Mode

press the bug button until you get to the mode you want. Then put the Bug Racer on the floor.

Wait for the countdown tones to finish, and the selected mode will start automatically.

HELPFUL HINT

Vehicle goes to sleep when left alone to conserve battery life. Press bug button to wake vehicle up and continue play in the mode selected prior to entering sleep mode. Alternatively, switch the power OFF and then ON again.

CRICKET IN CHARGE MODE

- Press bug button once.
- Cricket drives the car with motion sensor technology.
- When cricket goes left or right, car goes left or right.



HELPFUL HINT

- Race a friend!
- Press bug button twice on each Bug Racer. Each Bug Racer sold separately.
- See which Bug Racer drives the farthest in this straight-line 10-second race. Then press the bug button to race again.





HELPFUL HINT STEERING ADJUSTER: Vehicle should run in a straight line. If the vehicle yeers to the left, rotate the adjuster to the right (as necessary) to make the vehicle run in a straight line again. If the vehicle veers right, rotate the adjuster to the left.



AUTODRIVE MODE

- Press bug button a third time.
- The car drives automatically, without need for a cricket.





- Press bug button a fourth time.
- Use the lights to better observe your cricket. The vehicle will not move in this mode.
- Press the bug button again to return to the first mode.



HELPFUL HINT

VOLUME CONTROL: In all modes, there are 4 pre-set volume levels. Press and hold the bug button until you reach the desired volume. If you hold the button too long, the volume will reach the highest level and then gradually go down. The lowest volume setting turns OFF the music

VEHICLE TIPS

Wash hands thoroughly after handling habitat or vehicle. Vehicle works best on hard, flat surfaces. For indoor use only.

Don't store your vehicle near heat or in direct sunlight. Always turn switches OFF when not in use. Keep fingers, hair and loose clothing away from the wheels while the vehicle is switched ON. Don't play with the vehicle upside-down.

⚠ CAUTION: To prevent entanglement, keep hair away from wheels.

BATTERY INSTALLATION

Unscrew the battery cover with a Phillips head screwdriver (not included). Install 4 new AA (LR6) Alkaline batteries in the orientation (+/-) shown. Replace battery cover and tighten screw Replace the batteries if vehicle slows down or if sounds distort or lights dim. For longer life, use alkaline batteries. When exposed to an electrostatic source, the product may malfunction. To resume normal operation, remove and re-install the batteries.
